




Loch Ness Cruise

Relaxing music will be played during your comfortable drive back to Edinburgh. Times shown are approximate; please arrive at Waterloo Place 10 minutes prior to departure time.

Price is for transport and guided bus tour only. This tour is not suitable for younger children.

- Callander Take the opportunity to meet Highland Cattle or grab some coffee and souvenirs on our first stop of the day.
- Great Moor of Rannoch One of the last remaining wildernesses in Europe, and a film location for many famous films and TV shows.
- Glen Coe We stop for a perfect photo opportunity at the site of the famous 1692 massacre of the Clan MacDonald.
- Loch Ness Spend time watching for Nessie, take a trip on the award-winning Cruise Loch Ness, or simply relax and enjoy a refreshment in a local hotel overlooking the view.
- Loch Laggan This fresh water loch is featured in the Temeraire series of novels, being used as a base to raise dragons, because of its geothermal heat sources.
- Pitlochry This beautiful Victorian village is situated in the heart of the stunning scenery of Highland Perthshire.

- Midhope Castle Lallybroch/Broch Tuarach. The exterior, archway and courtyard were used as the home of the Frasers, making this an essential photo opportunity for any Outlander fan.
- Blackness Castle Take in the castle's stunning location on the southern shore of the Firth of Forth, walk along the ramparts and explore the fictional headquarters of Jack Randall. In Outlander the castle stands in as Fort William.
- ◆ Linlithgow Palace As Wentworth Prison, it was here where Jamie was tortured by Captain 'Black Jack' Randall.
- Culross The streets here have appeared many times in Outlander. This virtually unchanged 16th-century village overlooks the sea and is the fictional town of *Cranesmuir*. There's time to visit Claire's herb garden, explore the palace, or wander along Culross's charming ancient streets.
- Falkland This small Fife village stood in as Inverness in Outlander. We stop for a wander round the Mercat Cross.
- South Queensferry Our final stop for views of the three spectacular bridges linking Edinburgh to Fife.



Rest And Be Thankful

Inveraray Castle

Relaxing music will be played during your comfortable drive back to Edinburgh. Times shown are approximate; please arrive at Waterloo Place 10 minutes prior to departure time. Price is for transport and guided bus tour only.

- **Doune Castle** This well preserved 14th century castle has been used as a location for Outlander, Outlaw King, Game of Thrones and Monty Python and the Holy Grail.
- ◆ Loch Awe and Kilchurn Castle We stop for a photo opportunity across this famous loch to one of the most photographed castles in Scotland.
- Inveraray This traditional county town overlooks the still waters of Loch Fyne. While we stop for lunch, why not visit the Castle which featured in Downton Abbey, or perhaps pop into the 19th-century jail.
- Rest And Be Thankful Pass After heading over the mountains from Inveraray, we take a brief stop for photos at this famous Scottish beauty spot.
- **Loch Lomond** The final stop at the village of Luss on the famous Bonnie Banks of Loch Lomond. Admire its quaint houses and stunning views across the loch.



Lindisfarne Castle

Relaxing music will be played during your comfortable drive back to Edinburgh. Times shown are approximate; please arrive at Waterloo Place 10 minutes prior to departure time. Price is for transport and guided bus tour only. Tour route and availability is subject to the tidal timetable at Holy Island, which may result in the tour operating in reverse.

- England Cross the gentle rolling hills of the Scottish Borders and into Northern England.
- ▶ Lindisfarne Also known as Holy Island, this tidal island is cut off from the mainland twice a day by the rising seas and is infamous for the bloody Viking raid on its monastery in 793AD. Don't miss the stunning coastal views, the castle, the rainbow arch of the priory ruins, and the opportunity to try the world famous 'Lindisfarne Mead' which many regard as the 'nectar of the gods'.
- Alnwick Castle Our main stop of the day, this is the second largest inhabited castle in the UK. From flying broomsticks, learning quidditch and crashing the Weasley family car, this castle featured in the Harry Potter films as Hogwarts and you may also recognise sets from Downtown Abbey.
- East Coast On the journey back to Edinburgh, relax and enjoy the views as the beautiful East Lothian coastline and countryside pass by.



Departs MARCH to OCTOBER **Daily**

Leaves Waterloo Place at 8.30am, arriving back at 6pm

- ◆ Forth Bridges Towering side by side over the Firth of Forth, these structures represent the pinnacle of engineering from three centuries. From an excellent vantage point, enjoy these three magnificent bridges that link Edinburgh to the Kingdom of Fife.
- **Dunfermline** Perhaps visit the ruins of the abbey, the resting place of King Robert the Bruce, recently portrayed by Chris Pine in Outlaw King.
- ◆ Anstruther We stop for lunch in this quaint fishing village, home to award winning fish and chips. Enjoy exploring the cobbled streets and a walk along the seafront harbour.
- St. Andrews Explore this vibrant seaside town, home of golf and where Prince William and Kate Middleton first met at the famous University, whilst immersing yourself in the winding streets with local shops and cafes.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Tour Dates:

Tours operate on the days shown, at the approximate departure and approximate return times shown. No tours run on 25, 26 December or 1 January.

Children:

We do not carry children under the age of 6 years. All children on the coach must occupy a seat and use the lap belt provided at all times. Tour 1 "Loch Ness, Glencoe and the Highlands of Scotland" is a long day and strictly not suitable for younger children. In order to obtain a child price, we reserve the right to ask for that child's proof of age.

Free Pick Up Service (Central Departure Point):

Our main departure point is from Waterloo Place in the Clty Centre and just east of Princes Street. If you would like to request an alternative pick up point please contact us to find out more. We ask that you arrive promptly for your tour as we regret that we cannot wait on late arrivals.

Drop Offs:

Our main drop off point will be at Waterloo Place. If you would like an alternative drop off point we can make several stops on the way back into the City – simply ask the driver and where possible you will be dropped off where requested.

WiFi:

This service is dependent on a wifi-fitted coach being available for the tour. We reserve the right not to offer this service on every departure. Signal coverage may be limited or unavailable in certain areas of the tour.

On-board conveniences:

Where possible, we will provide a coach with an on-board toilet. However, we cannot always guarantee this.

Cancellations/Alterations:

We reserve the right to alter tour itineraries due to weather, availability of attractions or road conditions, and under no circumstances can we be held responsible for these alterations. We reserve the right to vary, modify or cancel any itinerary, either part or wholly due to circumstances beyond our control. Please note we require a minimum number of passengers in order to operate a tour. If this number is not reached, the tour will be cancelled and passengers already booked will be offered an alternative date, tour or full refund.

Prices Do Not Include:

Gratuities to the driver/guide, admission to attractions (unless shown), attraction extras (unless shown) or lunch.

Refunds:

We've collated a short list of questions our customers ask. If you have any other questions please contact us and we'll try to help.

Q: Where does the tour leave from?

A: We offer multiple departure points around Edinburgh City Centre. See the back page for more information and a map showing our central departure points.

If you are staying outside the city or coming from a private address we can arrange your nearest pick up point.

Q: Will I be dropped off where I was picked up?

A: We will drop off back at Waterloo Place.

If you are staying on the route back into the City we can drop you off - your driver can discuss this with you. We drop off at convenient points back to the City Centre.

Q: Are meals included in the tour prices?

A: No, but meal stops are scheduled in the tours for your convenience.

Q: Do we make comfort stops during the tour?

A: Yes, we make regular stops during the tours, most of which have toilet facilities.

Q: Are entrances included within the tour price?

A: No. Attractions and boat trips are optional and tickets must be purchased separately. However, the driver can offer discounts to some attractions.

Q: How long does the boat trip last?

A: The Loch Lomond Cruise lasts approximately 1 hour. The Loch Ness Cruise lasts approximately 50 minutes.

Q: Are children allowed on the coach?

A: Yes, if they are 6 years or older.

Q: What time do the tours arrive back into Edinburgh?

A: Please refer to each tour page in this brochure for these times.

Q: Are the tours offered in other languages?

A: No, the tours are in English (Scottish) only. However, we do offer a short written tour description in French, German, Italian, Portugese, Spanish, Chinese and <u>Japanese</u>. These are available with advance request.
